

# Outstanding Scholarly Contribution Award

## *Purpose:*

This award recognizes exceptional research in librarianship, library science, and research into problems, challenges, and/or issues in libraries published by a Florida librarian or library staff member during the past two years. Research projects may include published books, book chapters, journal articles, white papers, bibliographies, or other significant contributions to library literature. *Blog posts, master's theses, and doctoral dissertations are not eligible.* Submissions will be judged based on their contributions to the field of librarianship.

## *Eligibility:*

Nominee must:

- Be a librarian or library staff in Florida; Joint author proposals are acceptable, but all authors must be Florida Library Association members and will split the award.

The nominator must be a current member of the Florida Library Association.

## *Criteria:*

- Importance of the research question or problem
- Adequacy of the review of relevant literature
- Effectiveness of the methodology
- Articulation of conclusions resulting from the research
- Application of the findings to the field of librarianship
- Level of innovation in the topic and findings

*Required Information:* Submit a PDF of the research noted in the application. If the submission is a book, please include only PDFs of the relevant chapters for review (4 chapters maximum).
